Item Action

1 Introductions

- 1.1 Jim Claydon (The Chair) welcomed attendees and opened the meeting.
- 1.2 David Eccles (DE) informed forum members of a fatal road incident which happened on the C182 on Monday 20 January 2020. DE said that it would be inappropriate to raise questions or speculate regarding the circumstances around this incident whilst the investigation by the Police was ongoing. Our thoughts are with the family and friends of the deceased at this time.
- **1.3** The Chair then asked all attendees to introduce themselves.

2 Meeting Note and Matters Arising

2.1 The Chair reviewed the previous Community Forum meeting note from 3 October 2019 including the actions and after-notes inviting any further comment.

The Chair made reference to the more concise style of the meeting note and requested that members continue to keep their questions brief and to the point in order to facilitate the running of the meeting.

- 2.2 Item 3.2 Allan Jeffrey (AJ) explained that his query regarding the sea wall had initially concerned its height.
- 2.3 Item 4.2 Sue Goss (SG) commented that her question was not recorded correctly but that her query had been answered elsewhere.
- 2.4 Item 3.2 Stuart Hill (SH) shared with the meeting that signage was in place now but damage to the layby had already occurred. SG added that the sign referred to HPC traffic only. Alastair Higton (AH) said he would take this up as signage should be for all HGVs not just HPC.

2.5 Members then agreed the meeting note.

3 Project Progress

3.1 DE gave an overview of the recent progress on site. This was then followed by a short film fronted by Stuart Crooks, Managing Director of HPC, in which he looks ahead to activity on site in 2020.

- **3.2** Follow up questions and points of clarification included:
 - How many apprenticeships have been created?
 529 apprentices have worked on the HPC project so far. This topic was picked up at length in Item 5.
 - More information was requested about the Mental Health First Aider initiative.
 Immy Silby (IS) gave a very brief overview and suggested that a presentation is given at the next Community Forum. SH offered his assistance with regards to plans for creating allotments at the Bridgwater Campus.
 - Impact on project schedule in the light of recent bad weather.
 - DE confirmed that despite challenging site conditions recently, for example in relation to lifting operations in high winds, the project remains on track.
 - Could Luke Stevens (LS) from HPC attend future Community Forums, to update on wildlife and landscape matters as he does at the Main Site Forum?

- Will there be any applications for material or non-material changes to the DCO in 2020?
 - DE confirmed that the picture will be clearer later in the year as to which applications would be required. Appropriate consultation or engagement activity will take place and the fora will be kept updated.
 - Regarding the changes to the site 'plot plan', DE explained that a DCO application would be required to amend this. The application is likely to contain minor adjustments to the position and dimensions of some of the buildings on site.
 - DE also reported that conversations are at an early stage with the local authorities with regards to potential increase to workforce numbers. The current situation is that HPC are jointly working with the councils to look at various scenarios in relation to increase workforce and the potential impact of these. One element of this scenario planning involves looking at adjusting shift patterns to ensure the numbers of buses remain constant but will be run at a greater capacity. The fora will be kept up to date on progresses over the course of the year.
- Could more detailed plans be provided about works at Combwich Wharf?
 It was confirmed that more detailed plans would be available at the next Parish Council briefing session.
- Could a map of the footpaths around the site be provided?
- There was a report of noise disturbing residents of Shurton & Burton from a stone crusher, could this be looked into?
 Forum members were reminded to report activities via the website or email

- Could a presentation be given to the forum regarding the sea wall now that the work is almost complete?

 The sea wall may well feature in a regular update as wider works progress.

- Was there any update on the Acoustic Fish Deterrent (AFD)?
 Lisa Wright (LW) from The Environment Agency (EA) update the forum. She
 confirmed that this currently sat with them, and that the EA had not yet arrived at
 its conclusion; they have engaged some external independent support to assist
 and there may be more to report around June time. If the permit is granted or
 granted with conditions attached, then there will be a further round of public
 consultation.

5 Update: Inspire Programme

- 5.1 Tom Thayer (TT) gave an update on the Inspire programme: This presentation is available at: www.edfenergy.com/hpccommunity
- **5.2** Follow up questions / points of clarification included:
 - TT clarified that the film showed young people but you can be an apprentice at any age and the job service do advertise these to all.
 - How many people will be employed when HPC is operational and how many of those will be local?
 - There will be around 900 staff when the plant is operational, and the target for local workers is 34% (within 90 minutes commute time), across the lifetime of the project. TT highlighted that job types / opportunities at HPC are included in the primary school assemblies that the team run to get the message out as early as possible.
 - TT clarified that the 'Talent Academies' referred to in the presentation where initiatives not organisations or buildings.
 - The 'Learn Live' Apprenticeships LIVE with EDF Energy (Hinkley Point C) was viewed by over 9,500 students.
 - The next podcast will be in collaboration with Chilton Trinity School, Bridgwater on 5 February 2020.

SH welcomed that the benefits of training and employment to the area were far exceeding the targets that were established at the time of the enquiry.
