What experience will I gain during the Procurement programme?

During your training you'll complete four placements over two years. These assignments will offer the opportunity to lead and support procurement and supplier management activities to ensure goods and services are delivered safely, are high quality, arrive at the right time and at the best price possible.

What kind of placements will I complete?

The programme is designed to help you develop a broad set of skills, with the opportunity to specialise towards the end of the programme when you'll start to think about a permanent role.

Following a week-long induction with graduates from all of our schemes in September, you'll head straight to your first placement. Assignments could include:

In the **Governance and Performance** teams within Supply Chain, you'll learn about the tools, processes and procedures that are at the heart of any procurement and supply chain function. You'll help to ensure the right data is available to the buying teams of EDF, co-ordinating necessary reporting and compliance procedures.

Within the Corporate and Customers **Buying** teams you'll work in a procurement and supplier relationship management capacity: supporting and running tenders, evaluating bids, placing contracts and working with current suppliers to give you a great understanding of the end to end procurement cycle. Projects could include supporting our Field Operations (e.g. SMART meter roll out), Corporate business (e.g. Facilities Management or HR contracts), or IT infrastructure (e.g. telephony and hardware contracts).

You may also get the opportunity to work across other organisations within the EDF family, for example within our growing **Renewables** business or **Imtech** areas. We collaborate with other business areas in EDF in the UK, so there could be a chance to gain experience in areas such as **Nuclear Development** or within our **Hinkley Point C** and **Sizewell C** supply chain support teams.
