

Southern Infrastructure Project Update – August 2020

The main phase of works has now begun in the Southern Area of land (adjacent to Shurton Road) to construct the Emergency Access Road for the power station.

You'll see that welfare facilities have been erected and work has been completed on the hedge row running alongside Shurton Road.

The main focus for August will be construction of the Emergency Access Road from Shurton Road towards Bum Brook.

Other works include:

- Completing the Bum Brook stream diversion
- Building a temporary plant crossing across Bum Brook. This will be a temporary measure allowing larger construction vehicles to access the works area via site, reducing the traffic on local roads
- Progressing with works to join the Emergency Access Road up with Shurton Road, creating a curved entrance known as a Bell Mouth. Periodic traffic lights will be in place on Shurton Road to support this
